Charting new terrain with Grammy-winning violinist, Charlie Bisharat, this contemporary World-chamber trio of oud, violin and guitar gracefully moves between the classical and the modern. By subtly interweaving tradition and sophisticated innovation to create an intricate musical tapestry that they perform with freshness and originality, Al-Andalus Ensemble has earned a devoted international audience. For festival settings, the Al-Andalus Ensemble expands with additions of modern Andalusian dance as well as trumpet, vocals, piano, bass and drums for a vital, energetic and absolutely beautiful experience!

The core of the Al-Andalus Ensemble is the married couple Tarik and Julia Banzi, who make their home in both Morocco and the USA. Their lives reflect their commitment to creating peaceful understanding between the East and the West. Inspired by the Renaissance, they are scholars, musicians and artists whose lives reflect a commitment to create peaceful understanding between the East and the West. They present historically informed performances of Andalusian works and also create new compositions that are rooted in the Andalusian legacy.

The Al-Andalus Ensemble takes its name from a medieval story of peace: Between 711 and 1492, Spain witnessed the cultural synthesis of Africa, the East and the West, and of Muslims, Jews and Christians. The era and region in which these groups so peacefully co-existed is known as “Al Andalus.” An outstanding model of tolerance and multiculturalism, Al-Andalus produced remarkable artistic, scientific and cultural enlightenments that set the stage for the European Renaissance. The music, song and dance that inform the Al-Andalus Ensemble’s repertoire serve as artifacts of this peaceful society, acting as outstanding examples for the resolution of modern-day conflicts and challenges. The Al-Andalus Ensemble draws creative impetus from the rebirth of Al-Andalus in today’s cultural landscape.

The Al-Andalus Ensemble pursues a singular artistic vision which reminds us that the intricate interplay of diverse voices is the geography of cultural harmony. Far from the scholarly approach of Early Music or the traditionalism of much World Music, this collaboration generates a dynamic, new hybrid: a contemporary World-chamber ensemble that skillfully creates new and original music, retaining the essential soul and spirit of its Arab, North African and European heritage.

AL-ANDALUS ENSEMBLE, ARTISTS

TARIK BANZI (Oudist, Composer) traces his roots back to Al Andalus, Spain. He was born to one of the old Andalusian families in Tetuan, Morocco and grew up immersed in the Andalusian musical tradition. Tarik has collaborated with flamenco and Jazz masters such as **Paco de Lucia, Manolo Sanlucar, Enrique Morente** and **Jorge Pardo** and has introduced cornerstones of modern flamenco such as the darbuka (clay or metal drum) and Udu (clay pot drum). Tarik's musical versatility can be heard in the works of Classical, Jazz, Folk, New Age, Rock and World Music artists such as **Billy Oskay (Nightnoise), Guadalquivir, La Trinca, Tijeritas, Michael Shreive** and **Graham Leer (Carlos Santana), Dan Crary, Carolyn Cruso, Lief Sorby, Magical Strings, Paul Winter, John Doan, Oregon Repertory Singers** and **Enrique Valdivieso**. Tarik's students Fain Duenas and Vicente Molina went on to form the Grammy-nominated World music group **Radio Tarifa**. Tarik is an accomplished visual artist who completed his Doctoral studies in Fine Arts at the **Complutense University** of Madrid, Spain. His artwork is included in collections throughout the world.



CHARLIE BISHARAT (Violinist) His work has graced the albums of such pop artists as **Alanis Morissette, The Rolling Stones, Jane's Addiction,** and **Aerosmith**. He can be heard on the works of Jazz and World Music artists **Strunz & Farah, Don Grusin,** and **Oscar Castro-Neves**. His expertise has been featured on the big screen in soundtracks such as **Swordfish, Texas Rangers, Steal Big Steal Little** and on the small screen on **The Drew Carey Show** and **Friends**. A **Grammy-winning performer**, Mr. Bisharat has toured the world time and again with Jazz and New Age groups as varied as **Shadowfax, Kitaro, Yanni** and **John Tesh**. He has composed and produced tracks for record-setting album projects as well. His range of styles has led him from pop to jazz to classical, and he is often heard subbing with the **Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra** and the **Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra**. A published author as well, Charlie has written and recorded the jazz improvisational book and CD **Beyond Classical Violin** for Cherry Lane Music. His works for small ensembles range from the original opus **Lying In Wait** by the all-female quartet Cello, to string arrangements for rock guitarist **Andy Summers** of **The Police**. Charlie continues to travel the globe performing in concert and recording with some of the most accomplished musicians of our time.

JULIA BANZI (Ph.D) (Guitarist, Ethnomusicologist) The world of guitar boasts few women who ignite the sound of the guitar, and in the flamenco culture, even fewer still. Julia lived in Spain for over a decade, where she specialized in flamenco and established herself as one of the very few female flamenco guitarists worldwide. In Andalucia, and later at Madrid's **Amor de Dios** studios, Julia worked accompanying notable dance instructors such as **Ciro, La Tate & Manolete** and studied with some of Spain's finest guitarists including **Manolo Sanlucar, Isidro Muñoz, David Serva, Felipe Maya** and **Juan Maya "Marote."** Her passion for flamenco led her to explore its roots in an academic context, and she completed her doctorate in Ethnomusicology at the **University of California, Santa Barbara**. Her work reflects her many years of living, studying and performing throughout the world. She teaches guitar at **Reed College** and **Lewis & Clark College**.



EMILY MILES (Voice) is one of Portland's up-and-coming young singers. She grew up in Seattle, and later spent time living and studying in the Canary Islands, Cuba and the Dominican Republic. She graduated from Lewis & Clark College where she completed research on the Cuban hip-hop movement and the music of the Farmworker Movement, two projects that deepened her understanding of music as a powerful tool of social change, organization and cultural dignity. Emily brings a distinctly North American element to the Al-Andalus Ensemble, adding American roots and blues influences to the group's already multicultural repertoire.

LAURA DUBROCA (Modern Andalusian Dance) Born in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates to French ex-patriot parents, Laura has lived in Venezuela, Qatar, Indonesia and France, taking diverse cultural influences from each of the countries she has called home. She began classical ballet studies at an early age and later discovered her love of flamenco. She has studied flamenco dance with **Manolo Marin, Milagros Menjibar, Carmen Ledesma** and **Rafael Campallo** in the **Fundación Cristina Heeren de Arte Flamenco** in Sevilla and with **Manuela Ríos, Adela Campallo, Juana Amaya, Pastora Galvan,** and **Angeles Gabaldon**. She lives in Madrid, Spain where she is a regular performer in the flamenco peñas **La Perla de Cadiz, Asociación Cultural Antigua Sevilla, Espacio Temporal, Agua Fresca** and in concerts with international harpist **Meko**.

ANTHONY JONES (Drums) Anthony is considered one of the best young drummers on the West Coast. He is the younger brother of the bandleader **Eldon "T" Jones**. They come from a very talented musical family. In high school he also won numerous awards playing the trumpet. GAVIN BONDY (Trumpet) Gavin is a native of Portland, OR and is best known for his work as premier trumpeter for **Pink Martini**. His versatility and love of music has allowed him to work with bands and orchestras in a great variety of genres including classical, rock, country, funk, American folk, big band, salsa, free jazz, mariachi, and Middle-Eastern music. In between **Pink Martini** shows, he writes, arranges, and performs with the group he founded, the **Shanghai Woolies**, a band of renegade rock musicians who play hot jazz.
